- Patrolling around Downtown's Central Business District, the Public Safety Ambassadors serve as extra eyes and ears for the police and act as goodwill ambassadors on behalf of Downtown. Ambassadors are available to give directions, escort employees, residents, and visitors to their destinations and address safety concerns.
- Public Maintenance Ambassadors help clean and maintain Downtown’s public areas. The ambassadors sweep away trash and litter; remove graffiti and work diligently to resolve outstanding infrastructure issues in parks, on the street deck and other public areas.
